The different ATIS have been edited to avoid giving away too many indications. Then fill in the grid with the help of these elements and the 15 clues below.

- 1 G-DAYS is a Europa.
- 2 G-SSCA will be landing on runway 27.
- 3 G-RWST's planned destination has few clouds at 2200 feet.
- 4 The BE58 is parked to the immediate left side of the DA42.
- 5 Visibility at the BE58's arrival airfield is 10 kms or more.
- 6 The pilot who will be landing on runway 36 will do so in haze.
- 7 The Robin will be landing in mist.
- 8 The aircraft parked at the centre is going to the airfield where the wind varies between 310° and 030°.
- 9 G-BZIJ is parked on A1.

- 10 The pilot who will have to worry about the Danger area 141 is parked next to the one who will be landing on runway 06.
- 11 The pilot who will be landing on runway 21 is parked next to the one who will be landing in mist.
- 12 Find out the present weather at EGPA.
- 13 NOSIG is expected at N 678J's field of destination.
- 14 G-BZIJ is parked next to a C172.
- 15 The pilot who will have to worry about the Danger area 141 is parked next to the one who will be flying to the airport with a transition level of 50.
